#### **Malaria Infection – Aircrew**

All aircrew members, including cabin staff are warned of the risk of contraction of malaria when passing through or stopping over in parts of Africa where malaria is endemic.


Effective drugs for the prevention or suppression of malaria are available and should be used whenever a possibility of acquiring the disease exists. A single mosquito bite may be sufficient to transmit infection.

The following points should be noted when taking anti-malaria drugs:

- a) They should be taken from the arrival day in an endemic area and until four weeks after the last possible exposure.
- b) The recommended dosage should be carefully followed.

Where persistent or recurrent feverish illness occurs after return from a malaria area, the doctor should be informed of the risk of a malarial infection. Cases of malaria have been initially treated as influenza.

Remember, malaria is one of the major killer diseases in the world.
